## Caroline Kent A short play about watching shadows move across the room

In A short play about watching shadows move across the room, painted images and high-relief sculptures merge into scenes that both break interpretation and underscore its tensions. Using an all black background as her base, Caroline Kent brings together "shadow shapes," improvised figures and hand-painted floor plans to construct domestic spaces — depicting rooms, grids, and plant life.

The pastel palette used throughout the mural recalls the Rococo and Eastern Baroque architectures of Transylvania, where Kent spent time as a Peace Corps volunteer. Imposed over the colorful forms, the floor plans provide an experimental landscape for communication and exchange. Across the imagined map, multidimensional sculptures are then able "to move from blackness, to shadow, to

surface, and to relief." In their fluidity, the layered objects create a notation that prioritizes intuition and mutability and evades the confinement of definition.

Throughout her practice, Kent, an abstract painter and text-based artist, uses multilayered compositions to consider the limits of verbal expression and the vastness of the unknown. Characterized by black landscapes and floating objects, her paintings attempt to make clear the space of possibility that precedes the invention of language and the limits of definition. Widening the margins of modernist abstraction, Kent's improvisational mark-making manipulates the rhythms and tones of communication to arrive at a visual vocabulary that surpasses cultural differences. Through an expansive visual form, Kent conjures a realm for feeling and expression while leaving room for meaning that is silent, secret, and unknowable.
